Report of The 19th Council (2003-2005) For The Period 1 April 2004 - 31 March 2005

The history of family medicine will probably look back on 2004 as the year when reform of primay care began in earnest in Singapore. It is said that the night is darkest just before the dawn. Amidst the groans of family physicians trying to deliver good primary care under an increasingly difficult environment, positive developments are taking shape that will transform primary care and empower family physicians to take their rightful place as the personal physician of the people.

The call for action was made at the last Annual General Meeting when the general body endorsed the proposal for the graduate diploma in family medicine to be recognised as the national vocational standard for family doctors in Singapore. The College initiative to transform primary care in 2004 was kicked off with a study visit to Scotland. This was followed by a flurry of seminars and dialogues with family physicians and stakeholders in primary care. There was agreement that the problem is challenging and the solution calls for adopting a mulit-pronged approach to remove barriers at different sites and levels of care. There was also consensus that we should focus more on the quality of care instead of the quantity of care. Quality and transforming primary care thus became the theme of this year's activities of the College.

The Council and the various Standing Committees are pleased to report the hightlights of the activities of the College in the year ending 31 March 2005.

Academic Programmes

Graduate Diploma in Family Medicine

The Graduate Diploma in Family Medicine programme continues to improve with time and is gaining recognition as a professional and vocational standard. It was positioned since its launch in 2000 as the standard of essential training in the discipline of family medicine. It is increasingly recognised by health care providers and policy makers as such. In the coming year it will be adopted as mandatory training for the first part of the Masters of Medicine (Family Medicine) programme. The Ministry of Health had given in principle agreement to the College's proposal to make the GDFM the recognised vocational standard of training for family doctors. The coming year should see more concrete measures in promoting this standard of training. Plans are also in place to improve the structure and content of the training. The College had called for the pooling of trainers and resources so that the training effort can reach critical mass. The College is also working on the formation of a part-time training faculty to support our pool of dedicated volunteer tutors, resource persons, supervisors and examiners.

The quality of the content of the course continues to improve with new innovations. The training strategy is to make the course learner centered and interactive. An e-learning component was introduced to the June 2003 intake and this will be expanded in the coming year. Continuing assessment will be introduced using the e-learning platform. The workshop notes and training materials can be downloaded from the e-learning website for pre-reading purposes and the two electives courses, Principles and Practice Skills (P & P) and Communication & Counselling (C & C) skills courses are now conducted via the elearning platform.

In year 2004, the induction of the 5th intake of GDFM trainees was held at the MOH Auditorium and 48 doctors were admitted into the GDFM programme.

The GDFM examination was conducted over a 2-day period on 17 & 18 July 2004. There were 59 candidates of which 50 passed and 9 failed the examinations. 7 trainees did not apply for examinations.

The examinations consist the following:

 A 2-hour multiple choice question paper 	25%
 A 1-hour key feature problem theory paper 	25%
 A 2-hour Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE) 	50%

MCFP by Assessment and the College Professional Development Programme (CPDP)

The MCFP by Assessment award was mooted to upgrade existing criteria for award of the Collegiate membership and bring it in line with international standards and the global trend of award by objective assessment and validation of training.

Entry requirement is the attainment of the GDFM or equivalent academic degree, professional good standing and ordinary membership of the College for at least 2 years.

The CPDP programme which leads to the award by assessment comprise a course of 3 modules and the normal duration of the programme is 2 years. Completion within 1 year is allowed if the candidate can complete the modules within 1 year.

The modules are: Consulting, Communication and Counseling Skills Course Clinical Quality Skills Course Professional Development Project

A summative assessement is carried out at the end of the programme and successful candidates will be awarded the MCFP(S).

The MCFP by assessment and the CPDP was launched at the commencement of the academic year 2004.

Institute of Family Medicine

At the year 2001 annual general meeting, the idea of forming an Institute of Family Medicine within the College was mooted. In August 2002, A/Prof Goh Lee Gan was appointed as the Consultant to the Institute of Family Medicine. He is assisted by our Executive Director, Dr Lee Kheng Hock. The role of the IFM is to develop the academic programmes of the College. It serves as a think tank in family medicine training. A part-time teaching faculty will be created in the coming year to further improve the quality of the training materials. New content and programme and training concepts will also be introduced.

Continuing Professional Development Activities

Continuing Medical Education

Compulsory Continuing Medical Education introduced in 2003 is now entrenched in the professional lives of doctors. The beginning of the new 2-year cycle sees an increase of events and activities. The minimum CME point requirements for family medicine will remain unchanged. There is consensus that the quality of the CME programmes can be further improved to make them more relevant to health care needs of the country. The College is represented in the SMC CME Co-ordinating Committee and works closely with the Singapore Medical Council to ensure that the quality of the CME events is acceptable. The Singapore Medical Council had formed an Accreditation of CME Providers Workgroup. The College is represented in this workgroup. The coming year will see efforts to improve the quality of programmes through better accreditation of both programmes and organisers.

E-Learning

The E-learning programme launched in 2003 as an innovative new channel of training and professional development is gaining ground. As with most new innovations, it was well received by the early adopters who find it challenging, refreshing and rewarding. Many busy practitioners are happy to be able to learn and earn CME points at their own pace and time.

To date, doctors have earned a total of 2085 CME points through the e-learning website.

Module 1: Disease Transmission & Counselling Skills

Module 2: Adolescent & Child Health

Module 3: Principles & Practice

Mdoule 4: Communication & Counselling

Participants who successfully complete a module will be able to gain 5 core FM CME points. The programme's emphasis is on active learning where participants are motivated to participate as an active learner. Assimilation of knowledge is reinforced with the platform's ability to interact with the learner and prompt for decision making.

The coming year will see incorporation of e-learning into the many structured training programmes of the College. The medical profession had often been criticised as laggards in the adoption of information technology. An additional benefit of the e-learning programme is to challenge this perception and to bring the benefits of information technology to professional development.

Family Practice Skills Course

With the College increasingly taking on the role of evaluating and accreditating CME programmes, it has consistently adhered to the policy of not co-organising and providing nominal sponsorships to events organised by healthcare service providers and commercial organisations. The College had also stopped organising ad-hoc events and instead focused

on structured courses that are crafted to meet the needs of practising family physicians. The Family Practice Skills Courses was developed for such a purpose.

Taking into consideration our limited resources and manpower, the College set itself to produce a minimum of 4 courses per year. Where resources permit, more may be conducted within a year.

Components of the Course:

- Distance learning course six units
- Two Seminars
- One Clinical Teaching Session
- Reading papers: A Selection of 10 papers will be presented. Course participants are advised to choose up to five for self-study.

The components may vary from course to course according to requirements.

As of 31st March 2005, the following family practice skills courses have been organised:

- Atherothrombosis
- Consulting, Communication & Counselling
- · Diabetes Mellitus
- Asthma Management

College Delegation To The University of Glasgow, Scotland, United Kingdom

The visit was made to study the primary care system under the NHS in Scotland and to draw lessons to improve primary care in Singapore. This historic visit energised the momentum to transform primary care in Singapore and helped to provide the vision and strategy to change.

Seminar On Transforming Primary Health Care

Stakeholders in primary care and members of the family medicine fraternity were invited to attend a seminar on transforming primary care organised by the College on the 15th May 2004. The delegation returning from their study trip to Scotland was eager to share their experience and to advocate quality improvement to the primary care fraternity. Professor K Satkunanantham, Director of Medical Services, Ministry of Health was the Guest of Honour at the seminar. The support of the Ministry of Health was evident and Prof Satku releterated that transforming primary care is one of the eight key priorities of the Ministry of Health. He felt that it was timely that the College is also giving significance to this area. He also outlined his vision of a better primary care system in Singapore by advocacy of the family doctor concept, organising primary care for optimal effectiveness and promoting the further training of family doctors.

The Seminar covered the following areas:

- · Comparative role and status fo general practitioners in Glasgow and Singapore
- · Quality assurance through audit and significant event analysis
- · Training and education in family medicine
- Improving service delivery
- · Drawing lessons from the study visit
- Question and answers session with the participants

At the end of the session, there was consensus that the present trends of development in primary care will be detrimental to the care of patients in Singapore if it is not corrected. There is a need to focus on quality of care and not just on quantity of care. The barriers to a better primary care system occur at different sites and level of care and we need a mutlipronged approach to remove these barriers.

The delegation was there to learn about organising a WONCA world conference in preparation for the next conference which will be held in Singapore in 2007. They were also there to establish networks with academics and potential sponsors of the conference in Singapore.

Visit By Dr Moya Kelly

Dr Moya Kelly, Assistant Director of NHS Education for Scotland, visited our College on the 21st October 2004. She was invited to Singapore as the External Examiner of the Master of Medicine (Family Medicine) Examination 2004. She was invited by the Practice and Quality Special Interest Group on "Rewards for Quality Clinical Practice". Dr Kelly gave an overview of the strategy to improve the quality of primary care in the United Kingdom. She also elaborated on the comprehensive measures instituted to reward primary health care providers based on how well they meet performance indicators set for a range of important chronic diseases. The lecture made many of the participants reflect on the causes of low quality of primary care in Singapore.

Feedback Sessions On Implementing The GDFM As The Minimum Required Vocational Standard

The proposal to make the GDFM the minimum required vocational standard was endorsed by the general body at the AGM. However there were concerns about issues in implementation. The College therefore conducted a series of focus group discussions with doctors who had experienced vocational training, namely the GDFM, the MMed(FM), the MCFP and the FCFP to seek their views to identify potention problems in implementation and operation. The sessions were conducted on the 27th October 2004. the 25th November 2004 and 2nd December 2004. Issues raised centred around 3 main areas. They are:

Training Structure

There was a need to create a national pool of trainers, mentors, examiners and other resources

Family Medicine Register

A family medicine register would probably be created. Such a register should be inclusive and should not threaten the livelihood of practising doctors.

The Value of Training

Whilst further training improved care and greater professionalism, it is not recognised by policy makers and payors of health services. It is difficult to get buy-in if these issues are not resolved.

Transforming Primary Care – A Grassroots' Perspective

Bringing the message of transforming primary care and quality improvement to the ground, the College held a dialogue cum seminar on this subject with rank and file members on the 15th January 2005. Notwithstanding the fact that no CME points were given and an abundance of concurrent CME events sponsored by pharmaceutical companies in various

hotels across Singapore, a capacity crowd of more than a 100 doctors attended the session at the College Lecture Room. It was a lively and frank meeting, starting with a series of personal reflections by invited speakers which gave perspectives from struggling family physicians working in both the public and private sectors. The highlight of the event was the question and answer session which saw active and spirited participation from many members of the audience. At the end of the three and ahalf hour session, there was acknowledgement that the practice environment of family physicians in both the private and public sector were difficult. There were widespread concerns tha the situation will deteriorate if we do not act to reverse the negative trends as a fraternity of family physicians, regardless of cluster or sector. There would probably be painful changes before we see an improvement in the practice environment and a more effective primary care system.

Activities of The Standing Committees

INTRODUCTION

The year 2004/2005 had been a year of developments in Family Medicine in Singapore. The Graduate Diploma in Family Medicine (GDFM) has been adopted as the Part I of the MMed (Family Medicine) for the 2005 intake of MMed (Family Medicine) trainees and beyond. The Ministry of Health's plans to improve the standard of family medicine through training are in the process of being finalised after consultation with the profession and the public.

MEMBERSHIP

Membership increased to a total of 1147 members as of 31st March 2005 compared to 1074 in the previous year. There were 74 retired members in the membership list. The distribution by grade of membership for the last three years are also shown below:

COMMENCEMENT OF THE ACADEMIC YEAR

The commencement of the academic year for 2005 will take place at the MOH auditorium on 25th June 2005.

THE GRADUATE DIPLOMA OF FAMILY MEDICINE (GDFM) EXAMINATION 2004

The Third GDFM Examination was held on 17 & 18 July 2004. Fifty of the 59 candidates passed, giving a passing rate of 85% for the GDFM examination 2004. The examination was developed by examiners appointed by the Family Medicine Committee. The Censors Board, which was the Examination Board, vetted and finalised all the questions. The standard set is a pass in all 3 segments.

The format of the 3 segments of the GDFM Exam are as follows: 100 MCQ questions (2 hours)

- 10 Key Features Problems (KFP) questions (1 hour)
- 10 OSCE stations (11 minutes per station comprising 8 minutes for testing and 3 minutes for marking)

The MCQ

There were 59 candidates in the GDFM examination 2004. There were three failures in this segment of the examination.

The KFP

The key features paper (KFP) tested the candidates' ability to manage and diagnose a clinical case on paper correctly. Almost all candidates did well in the KFP. There were no failures in this segment of the examination.

The OSCE

The OSCE examination aimed at assessing performance by peers of candidates in situations that approximate the real scenario of everyday practice. Each OSCE station is designed to simulate an office consultation and assessed the candidate on components of the consultation process, which include history taking, investigation, identifying problems, procedural skills, health education, counselling and ethical issues. The OSCE is not an 8 minute consultation but an 8 minute assessment of the components of the counsultation under scrutiny. Candidated must obtain a pass in at least 6 out of 10 cases. Seven failed the OSCE Examination.

A total of 32 examiners and 7 invigilators participated the examination process in July 2004. Thanks are also due to the Secretariat staff of the College and the Division of Graduate Medical Studies, NUS for their contributions. On behalf of the Board of Examiners, I would like to thank everyone for their contributions.

COLLEGE'S ROLE IN SMC-CME SCHEME

The College continues to support the SMC CME programme by participating in the SMC CME committee and advising on the CME needs/standards of family physicians in particular.

COLLEGE'S ROLE AS FM CME ASSESSOR

Since May 2002, College has been designated by the Singapore Medical Council to assess the FM CME event applications for core and non-core FM CME points. A two-step system for accrediting FM CME was set up, with the CME event organiser first crafting the programme with the advice of accredited FM CME advisor and then submits the application for assessment by the College CME Assessors' Board (CCAB). The following is an update of the CME processing system based on the respective CME categories:

Category 1A

To date, besides the College, the other accredited FM Approved Training Centres (ATCs) are NHG Polyclinic Centre, Singhealth Polyclinic Centre, NUS Family Medicine Centre and Graduate Family Medicine Centre. Organisations who wish to apply for the ATC status are to enquire with the Singapore Medical Council.

Category 1B

From January 2004 to December 2004, a total of 515 Category 1B CME applications were received. 495 applications were recommended for core FM CME, 18 applications were recommended for non-core FM CME and 2 applications were rejected.

The process of applying CME for Category 1B events has also been further streamlined. CME organisers only need to submit the hard copy of the application forms to the College, either by mail or by hand. Electronic copies are no longer required.

With effect from March 2004, the College only evaluates applications applying for core FM CME. All non-core applications would be handled directly by the Singapore Medical Council.

Overview of CME Applications Received In Year 2004

COLLEGE'S ROLE AS CME PROVIDER

The Family Practice Skills Course (FPSC) is a structured CME programme formulated to meet the increasing need for relevant skills training which complements our College's structured training programmes. It was started to meet the need of better CME training programmes when CME became mandatory on 1st January 2003. It would meet the needs of three groups of doctors:

- Those who attend certain components of the FPSC for Core FM CME. This is likely to be the biggest group;
- Those who attend all the components of an FPSC to qualify for skills certification; and
- Those enrolled in the GDFM who attend it as part of their elective skills course requirements.

Each FPSC may comprise a mixture of the following components:

- 1. Distance Learning with verification
- 2. Lectures
- 3. Workshops
- 4. Small group activities including clinical attachments, tutorials, ward-rounds
- 5. Assessments which can be written, oral, demonstration and/or clinical

The FPSCs that were held during the year are:

- Atherothrombosis
- Consulting, Communication & Counselling
- Diabetes Mellitus
- Asthma Management

To date, 10 FPSC courses have been organised since its inception on 27th October 2002. For the period 1 April 2004 to 31 March 2005, a total of 7008 CME points have been earned by doctors from passing the distance-learning module of 30 multiple-choice questions.

Typically, each module comes with 2 case scenario, 1 role-playing exercise, reading materials, multimedia clips, and a set of MCQ questions. Doctors who have attempted all components of the module including passing the MCQ test would be awarded with 5 FM CME points. The points are updated to the SMC –CME system at the closure of each module.

69, 79, 128, and 137 doctors have successfully completed the e-learning Modules 1, 2, 3 and 4 respectively and a total of 2065 CME points has been earned from these modules.

The Membership Committee successfully completed its task of setting up the Institute of Family Medicine. This is the arm of the College that will conduct all post-graduate training including the FMTP and GDFM programmes.

Members are given a copy of serialized bubbled form and they only need to shade the corresponding numbers of the SFP articles they have read and return the form back to the College within the stipulated deadline. The College would then compile and submit to SMC for CME points claims under Category 3A on behalf of its members.

The College continues to be the academic body entrusted with the role of certifying core CME programmes for Family Physicians.

The membership of the College increased from 1,074 at 1st April 2004, to 1,147 on 31st March 2005.

The 4-week Family Medicine posting ran smoothly. In the four-week posting, two weeks were spent in the GP setting and the second two weeks in the Polyclinic setting. In addition, the students were given a one day teaching and clinical exposure on palliative care. The students had a one-day attachment in pairs to a private paediatrician. For each week there were departmental teaching sessions to give the students a headstart on the knowledge and skills to be acquired for the week. There were also joint teaching sessions hosted by the COFM Departmental FM staff, full-time and part-time, and the Polyclinic staff.

The continuous assessment is also provided by the GP tutors and the Polyclinic tutors. The four case write-ups and a written end-of-posting test also add to the total continuous assessment mark.

The posting would not have been possible without the contribution of some 40 GP tutors per batch and some similar number of polyclinic tutors. Then there are also the 15 teachers in palliative care as well as the 12 private paediatricians. Their names are given on the next two pages.

On behalf of the University and the College of Family Physicians, the College's Undergraduate Committee is grateful for the support and appreciates the efforts of one and all in making the posting useful, meaningful and interesting to the students.

The Wonca 2007 organizing committee conducted monthly meetings for the entire year and was able to put together a scientific programme for the conference in July 2007. Some members of the committee also attended the 17th Wonca World Conference held in Orlando, USA from 13-17th October 2004 to learn from the organisers of the world conference as well as put up a publicity blitz for the 18th World Conference here in 2007. We were fortunate to have the generous sponsorship from Pfizer, GSK, MSD and Novartis thus covering more than 80% of the travel and accommodation expenses for the conference.

The team attended the different plenaries, lectures and symposiums; handing out flyers and door gifts to the delegates at the conference. In addition, the team also manned the booth at the exhibition and handled out numerous Singapore Tourism Board's fact book about Singapore. In general, a lot of interest has been generated for the conference in Singapore in 2007. The team also decided to offer a discount voucher to sell to potential delegates of our conference. We have met with measured success in our efforts to raise some funds to contribute toward our marketing drive and managed to sign up some more than 20 delegates from the US, UK and Europe and raise more than \$\$20,000 which will help to fund our future promotional drives.

The slide presentation followed by a short 7-minute video feature on Singapore (courtesy of Discovery Channel's Lonely Planet) was very well received by both the Wonca World Council (presented on the 11th October) and the Wonca World Conference delegates (presented on the 15th October). A total of some more than 600 delegates watched the presentation live in Orlando during lectures and an undisclosed greater number watched the unabridged version lasting more than 40 minutes at our exhibition booth.

The members attending the conference also formed an espirit de corp never achieved and brought the morale of the team to a new high, ready to take on the drive to make our conference the most successful ever in the history of Wonca. In the coming months ahead, the team will set down to tackle the more pressing issues of fund raising, calls for abstracts, posters and lectures, marketing the conference as well as creating new ideas to beef up the conference so that the attendance, programmes content and flow of the conference will be one etched in the memories of those who attended forever.

As part of the marketing efforts, the committee would also be sending a delegation to the next Wonca regional conference to be held in Kyoto, Japan from 27th to 31st May 2005 to publicise our conference in 2007.

For the last financial year ended 31st March 2005, the nett expenditure incurred amounts to \$\$3,229.76.

The College Finances remain healthy, with total income of \$\$572,417 and expenditure totaling \$\$526,257, resulting in a surplus of \$46,160 for the last financial year ending 31st March 2005. The College has managed to raise funds through development of CME modules and training of Family Physicians. Our partners in the pharmaceutical industry have been generous in providing grants for such programmes and we acknowledge their strong support. We have also been prudent in keeping costs low and hence have been able to achieve surpluses over the past few years.

For training programmes conducted by the College, we will attempt to recover costs for each event through sponsorships and fees collected from course participants. This is a discipline that should allow the College to continue having positive numbers at the bottom line.

Listed below is a table showing the income and expenditure of the 4 main programmes organized by the College in the last financial year.

The upper portion of the badge of the College consists of a golden lion in a passant stance superimposed on the chief which is red in colour.
