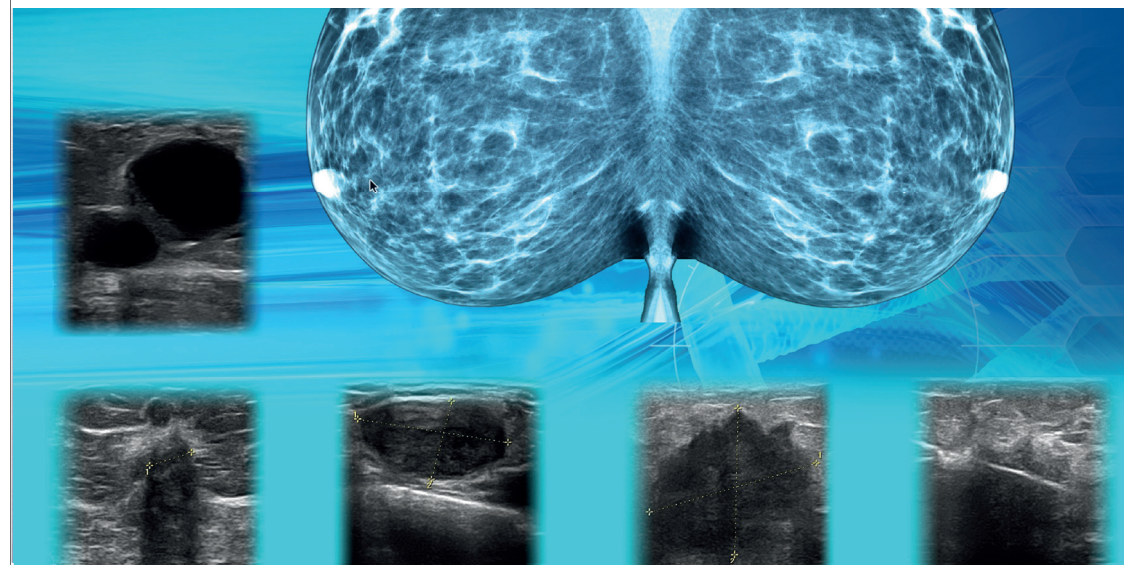

We hope to provide an update to our colleagues in primary care on the latest guidelines in screening; and give accurate, reliable working guidelines on workup and management of benign breast conditions. Some of the benign conditions do need follow-up for a few years, which may be done in a primary care setting. Many patients prefer a female doctor to do the routine yearly breast examination, hence it would be ideal for a female GP to continue the care of such patients, in addition to overall management of chronic conditions such as hypertension and diabetes.
