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INTRODUCTION

The education and training of doctors in the care of person with dementia is critical as the population of Singapore ages. The prevalence of dementia is on the rise and as family physicians, we need to arm ourselves with the necessary knowledge and skills to help our patients and their care givers cope with this impending 'epidemic'.

The National Dementia Network, together with the College of Family Physicians, decided that it would be useful to do this re-run of the skills course and to conduct this course on a regular basis so as to provide the opportunity for all primary care doctors in Singapore to refine their skills in the care of dementia patients.

For this course, we have kept the general format of the original skills course and have updated areas of the notes that have since changed. The workshops will continue to be practical and aims to allow maximal participation by the audience. Like previously, the 2 afternoon workshops are different and participants get to benefit from additional teaching and discussion by staying back after the lectures on the 2 separate days.
