This past year has been one of significant progress and continued dedication to our mission of advancing Family Medicine in Singapore and establishing it as a specialty, building on the solid foundation laid by our past leaders.

Notable Achievements and Milestones

WONCA APR Conference 2024

The College had the privilege and honour of hosting the 2024 WONCA Asia Pacific Regional Conference, which was held from 21 – 24 August. It was a resounding success, where family physicians from around the region and beyond had the opportunity to meet up with one another to discuss the latest advancements in Family Medicine, pick each other's brains, and be interact as part of the global Family Medicine community.

After more than two years of meticulous planning, we were thrilled to finally host more than 1,300 attendees from 39 countries. Our exhibitors set up 27 booths and 10 table-top exhibitions, facilitating discussions between doctors from all over the world.

A regional conference like the WONCA APR offers significant benefits to family doctors across the region. It provides a valuable platform for networking, professional development, and the sharing of new innovations relevant to primary care. Participants gain exposure to the latest updates in family medicine, engage in leadership and advocacy efforts, and share best practices tailored to diverse healthcare systems. Such conferences also foster a sense of shared purpose among family physicians and highlight local innovations, like Singapore's Healthier SG initiative, that can inspire change in other countries.

We had the honour of welcoming WONCA President Assoc Prof Karen Flegg to this event, and she gave several educational and informative presentations, at the Young Doctors' Movement and during the main conference itself. We were pleased that Health Minister Ong Ye Kung was our Guest-of-Honour at the opening ceremony where he delivered his speech. The event was reported in the local news channels.

I want to express my wholehearted thanks to everyone who made this possible, from family physicians both local and overseas who prepared their talks and research, to the numerous sponsors, to our hardworking College secretariat who ensured the event proceeded smoothly. I also want to make a special mention to our sponsors, including AstraZeneca, GSK, Boehringer Ingelheim, and Pfizer. Without all of their efforts, this event would not have been as successful as it was.

World Family Doctor Day—May 2024: Celebrating World Family Doctor Day, which falls on 19 May each year, we held a dinner at Parkroyal Pickering Hotel on 11 May 2024, recognising the invaluable contributions of family physicians to healthcare. The theme for this year was "Healthy Planet, Healthy People" and the event strengthened our community spirit and highlighted the important role family physicians play not only in promoting health and wellness, but also in protecting the environment. We were privileged to have Mr Chan Yeng Kit, Permanent Secretary (Health) as our Guest-of-Honour.

Commencement Ceremony—July 2024: Our Commencement Ceremony was held at Academia Auditorium on 27 July 2025. We welcomed a new batch of students into our programmes as we began the academic year.

College Convocation—November 2024: Our annual convocation was held at One Farrer Hotel on 30 November 2024. It was a grand celebration of academic achievements and professional milestones. We were delighted to have Mr Ng How Yue, Permanent Secretary (Services), Ministry of Health as our Guest-of-Honour for this event. Prof Tan Chorh Chuan, Permanent Secretary (National Research and Development) also delivered the Sreenivasan Oration.

Courses Conducted

Since its inception, the College has initiated and continually developed postgraduate programmes to address the needs of our family doctors. The Graduate Diploma in Family Medicine (GDFM), the Master of Medicine in Family Medicine [MMed(FM)] College Programme, and the Fellowship of the College of Family Physicians Singapore (By Assessment) [FCFPS] continue to thrive.

I extend my gratitude to the GDFM Programme Director and Assistant Programme Directors for their immense efforts in improving the GDFM training curriculum and increasing the resources available to the trainees. Their dedication has significantly enhanced the quality of training and support for our future Family Physicians.

Collaboration with Starry Night Foundation

Since February 2024, CFPS has been collaborating with Starry Night Foundation (SNF), a non-profit charitable trust in the field of scientific and medical research, to look at ways to close the gap in resources between Primary Care physicians in the public institutions and private sectors in Singapore. SNF generously provided an 85% subsidy for the UpToDate annual subscription fee for up to 300 CFPS members, allowing our members easy access to all that UpToDate has to offer. More details can be found in the Report of the 29th Council.

In the spirit of nurturing future leaders in Family Medicine, the College, with the generous support of the Starry Night Foundation, launched the CFPS-Starry Night Foundation Leadership Programme last year. Our first batch of five doctors completed their observership at The Mount Sinai Hospital New York from 11 to 22 November 2024. The five doctors were Dr Shen Fengli Sharon (Team Lead); Dr Goh Kuan Liang Shawn; Dr Lee Elin; Dr Tan Kian Wee Kenneth; and Dr Teo Cheng Rong. The experiences this quintet gleaned from the programme were invaluable, and will doubtless contribute to the continued improvement of Family Medicine in Singapore.

Commitment to Medical Ethics Education

In November 2022, the Singapore Medical Council informed doctors that compulsory CME on Medical Ethics would be required for Practising Certificate (PC) renewal in 2026. We have since been working closely with our sister Professional Bodies (PBs), the Academy of Medicine, Singapore (AMS), and the Singapore Medical Association (SMA), and launched our respective Mandatory Medical Ethics (MME) programmes in January 2024. This past year, the College conducted 2 webinars, 3 online MCQ sessions, and 3 PEL sessions. With further such programmes in the pipeline, we hope to provide a good education in and knowledge of Medical Ethics to participants regardless of membership.

Gratitude and Acknowledgements

As the term of the 29th Council comes to a close, I would like to place on record my heartfelt thanks to the members for their hard work and dedication, particularly their engagement in primary care workgroups, training committees, and various other initiatives. The 29th Council's achievements have laid a strong foundation for future growth and success, with their efforts instrumental in ensuring the continuous improvement of Family Medicine in Singapore.

I extend my deepest gratitude to the Secretariat for their tireless work behind the scenes, especially with the organising of the WONCA APR Conference. Their support has been invaluable in the smooth execution of our programmes and events, and their commitment has been a cornerstone of our success.

Furthermore, I am deeply grateful to the many members who have volunteered their time and energy to get involved in our teaching programmes as trainers, tutors, and examiners. The tireless efforts of our many friends of the College, who contributed their expertise and knowledge in our Family Practice Skills Courses, have been indispensable.

As we reflect on the accomplishments of the past year, we also look forward to the future with optimism and determination. The challenges ahead are numerous, but with the continued dedication and collaboration of our members, I am confident that we will rise to meet them.

CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT / MEDICAL EDUCATION PROGRAMMES AND COURSES

The College continues to promote Continuing Professional Development (CPD) and Continuing Medical Education (CME) through the following:

- Family Practice Skills Course
- Graduate Diploma in Family Medicine (GDFM)
- MMed (Family Medicine) College Programme
- Collegiate Membership Programme
- Fellowship Programme

The Institute of Family Medicine (IFM), an organ within the College, plays a significant role in developing the contents and syllabi of these programmes and courses.

During the year the IFM reviewed, updated, and edited the notes as well as their e-learning components for Modules 8, 1, 2, and 3 of the Family Medicine Modular Course to make them more relevant and user-friendly to the course participants.

The Family Medicine Modular Course consists of 8 modules of knowledge acquisition and is a requirement for doctors who are preparing for the Graduate Diploma in Family Medicine (GDFM) Programme and the Master of Medicine (Family Medicine) College Programme. Each year, four modules are covered.

For the year April 2024 - March 2025, there were 165 trainees registered in the GDFM course, 25 trainees in the MMed(FM) College Programme, and 25 trainees in the Fellowship [FCFP(S)] programme.

Family Practice Skills Course (FPSC)

During this financial year, the College conducted 10 Family Practice Skills Courses.

The components of a skills course traditionally include one or more of the following:

1. Distance Learning with verification (6 CME points upon attaining minimum pass grade of 60% in online MCQ Assessment)
2. Seminars (2 CME points per seminar)
3. Workshops (1 CME point per workshop)
4. Small group activities including clinical attachments, tutorials, ward-rounds (for some courses)
5. Assessments, which can be written, oral, demonstration and/or clinical (for some courses)

A typical FPSC template is a course with six units of distance learning with 30 MCQs test, conducted in two seminars, and also workshops conducted over two afternoon sessions typically, one on Saturday afternoon and one on Sunday afternoon.

College Programmes

The three College programmes and the FPSCs have resumed to in-person sessions after the pandemic. However, online and hybrid sessions continue to be used where appropriate, such as large audience didactic teaching. E-Learning will continue to be a significant part of all our programmes such as therapeutic notes, case scenarios, assessment by MCQs, and case reviews.

The College is also taking on more training programmes for GPs with the Healthier SG initiative and compulsory continuing medical education (CME) for ethics. These will also be a combination of in-person and online sessions.

Accreditation of Core CME Points

The College is represented by Adj Assoc Prof Tan Tze Lee in the Singapore Medical Council (SMC) CME Co-ordinating Committee. The College works closely with the SMC to ensure that the quality of the CME events is acceptable. It continues to advise SMC on the accreditation of core Family Medicine CME events through its panel of Family Medicine (FM) CME advisors appointed by the College.

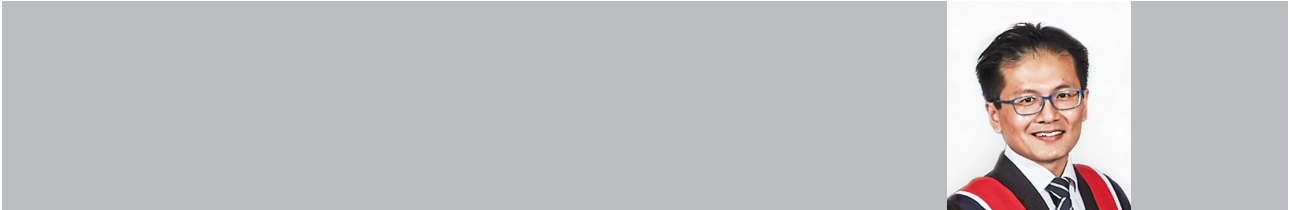

INDUCTION CEREMONY OF THE ACADEMIC YEAR

The Induction Ceremony of the academic year for 2025 will take place at NUS Shaw Alumni House on 26 July 2025.

GRADUATE DIPLOMA OF FAMILY MEDICINE (GDFM)

The Graduate Diploma in Family Medicine (GDFM) is a vocational training certification for primary care doctors. The aim of this 2-year part-time trainee programme is to train primary care doctors to practise Family Medicine at an enhanced level in order to meet the needs of the child, the adolescent, the adult, and the elderly. The course emphasises basic clinical, diagnostic, and management skills essential to General Practice.

The programme is planned to accommodate the busy doctor's schedule as almost all modules that require in-person attendance are conducted outside regular office hours. The course consists of the following:

- 8 modules of Family Medicine Modular Course (FMMC) with each comprising of 4 workshops, 1 tutorial, and MCQ assessments
- 3 Practice Management Courses
- 2 two-days elective Family Practice Skills Course (FPSC)
- 4 online Formative Assessments
- Mock Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE)

The Graduate Diploma of Family Medicine examination is conducted by the Division of Graduate Medical Studies (DGMS), National University of Singapore (NUS).

The examination format for the exams held were as below:

- Part 1 (Applied Knowledge Test): 180 MCQs — 2 papers (90 MCQs per paper, 2 hours per paper)
- Part 2: (Skills Assessment in the Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE) — 10 stations of 14 minutes each, comprising 3 minutes for reading, 10 minutes for consultation, and 1 minute for examiner clarification

The DGMS, NUS reviews the examination format on a regular basis.

The GDFM(NUS) is a title or qualification approved by the Singapore Medical Council for display by Registered Medical Practitioners.

The 22nd GDFM Examination was held on 4th May 2024 for the Part 1 FM AKT and 5 Jul, 6 Jul, & 12 Jul 2024 for the OSCE. A total of 106 of the 210 candidates passed, giving a passing rate of 50.47% for the GDFM Examination 2024.

MASTER OF MEDICINE (FAMILY MEDICINE) [MMed(FM)]

There are currently two programmes to prepare doctors for the MMed(FM) examinations.

Family Medicine Residency Programme

The Family Medicine Residency Programmes run by our respective Regional Health Clusters aim to equip the Family Medicine resident with educational and clinical experiences in accordance with Singapore Specialty Training Standards co-developed by the Joint Committee of Specialty Training, Joint Committee of Family Medicine Singapore, and Family Medicine Training Advisory Committee. Residents will undergo clinical rotations in the hospitals and polyclinics, run continuity clinic sessions, and attend didactic teaching sessions that combine foundation teaching and skills workshops.

MMed(FM) College Programme

The programme is a structured training programme designed for mature practising family physicians in Singapore. The programme is jointly organised by the College of Family Physicians Singapore and the DGMS, NUS. This 22-month part-time course provides a comprehensive and structured training programme for doctors working in primary care who have passed the 8 modules of the Family Medicine Modular Course (FMMC) to prepare them to sit for the MMed(FM) examinations.

The course participants from both the Programmes sit for the same examination — namely, the MMed(FM) examination conducted by the DGMS, NUS.

This examination consists of:

- Part 1 — Written
 - Applied Knowledge Test (180 multiple-choice questions)
- Part 2 — Clinical
 - Logbook-based VIVA
 - Slides-based Short Answer Questions
 - Clinical Skills Assessment Stations

The 34th Master of Medicine (Family Medicine) Examination was held on 4 May 2024 (Part 1 — Written), 12 October and 1, 2, 9 November 2024 (Part 2 — Clinical). Of the 129 candidates who sat for the examination (Part 2 — Clinical), 90 were successful.

THE AWARD OF MCFP(S) BY ASSESSMENT

The criteria for the award are as follows:

1) Professional

- Be an Ordinary or Associate Member of the College of Family Physicians Singapore for at least 2 years
- Has held a registrable or acceptable qualification for not less than 3 years
- Has been engaged in family practice for not less than 3 years and is currently in family practice for the past 1 year
- Has spent at least 3 months in primary ambulatory care within the last 3 years
- Be in professional good standing
- Currently in active clinical practice i.e. 24 clinical hours per week, of which 8 hours must be in a Family Medicine setting as defined by the College Constitution

2) Academic

- Possess MRCGP(UK) **AND** GDFM
OR
- Possess MMed (Internal Medicine) or MRCP(UK) **AND** GDFM

3) Assessment

Candidates will need to submit the following for assessment:

- Submit a log of 40 cases in the SOAP format showcasing the spectrum of Family Medicine comprising acute and chronic cases as well as preventive medicine
 - o There must be at least 5 **Obstetrics and Gynaecology** cases, 5 **Paediatric** cases, and 5 **Geriatric** cases submitted
 - o There must be at least one case presenting with a psychological condition
- Submit video consultations of 3 **Adult Medicine** cases and 3 **Paediatric** cases
 - o For the adult video, at least one case must be a **chronic medical condition**.
 - o For the paediatric case, at least one case must be that of a **developmental assessment**.
 - o All 6 video cases must be of different conditions
- Pass both the viva voce of the log of the 40 cases as well as the viva voce of the video consultations

No members were awarded the MCFP(S) by Assessment in 2024.

Family Practice Skills Course (FPSC)

The Family Practice Skills Courses (FPSC) continue to serve the continuing professional development needs of the General Practitioner/Family Physician. Each skills course includes one or more of the following components in which the family physician can choose to participate in:

- Distance Learning with verification (6 CME points upon attaining minimum pass grade of 60% in online MCQ Assessment)
- Seminars (2 CME points per seminar)
- Workshops (1 CME point per workshop)
- Small group activities including clinical attachments, tutorials, ward-rounds (for some courses)
- Assessments, which can be written, oral, demonstration, and/or clinical (for some courses)

In the financial year from 1 April 2024 to 31 March 2025, the Group derived its income mainly from course and seminar fees, sponsorships, advertisements, subscriptions, membership fees, rental income and interest income. The 6 items together accounted for 98.5% of its total income.

Fees from courses and seminars accounted for 76.5% of the total Group income, sponsorships accounted for 4.8% of the total income, subscriptions accounted for 8.1% of the total income. Specifically, income from organizing the WONCA Asia Pacific 2024 conference derived \$1,352,900 or 19.6% of its total income, excluding further income from the Singapore Tourism Board Grant to be accrued (capped at \$200,000, currently in processing).

In the financial year from 1 April 2024 to 31 March 2025, the Group's consolidated total income was \$6,889,884; the consolidated total expenditure for the same period was \$5,411,349. The consolidated net surplus for the financial year from 1 April 2024 to 31 March 2025 was \$1,475,154, a 6.6% increase despite lower interest income from lower fixed deposit rates.

I am pleased to report that the Group continues to be on a firm financial standing for the financial year 1 April 2024 to 31 March 2025.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS - 31 March 2025

The following notes form an integral part of the financial statements.

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The College of Family Physicians Singapore is a society registered in Singapore under the Societies Act 1966. It is also a charity registered under the Charities Act 1994. Its registered office is located at 16 College Road #01-02 College of Medicine Building Singapore 169854.

The principal activity of the College is to provide education services for postgraduate study courses.

The principal activity of the subsidiary company is set out in note 12 to the financial statements.

2. MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICY INFORMATION

2.1 Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are presented in Singapore dollars ("S\$"), which is also the functional currency of the Group.

These financial statements are prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention except as disclosed in the accounting policies below, and comply with Singapore Financial Reporting Standards ("FRSs"), including related Interpretations promulgated by the Accounting Standards Committee.

During the financial year, the Group adopted all the new and amended FRSs which are relevant to the Group and are effective for the current financial year. The adoption of these standards did not have any material effect on the financial performance or position of the Group.

2.2 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements

Estimates, assumptions concerning the future and judgments are made in the preparation of the financial statements. They affect the application of the Group's accounting policies, reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses, and disclosures made. They are assessed on an ongoing basis and are based on experience and relevant factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

(A) Key sources of estimation uncertainty

The key assumptions concerning the future and other key sources of estimation uncertainty at the balance sheet date that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year are discussed below.

(i) Depreciation on Property, Plant and Equipment and Investment Property

The cost of property, plant and equipment and investment property are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives. Management's estimates of the useful lives of these property, plant and equipment and investment property are disclosed in notes 2.8 and 2.9 respectively. Changes in the expected usage and technological developments could impact the economic useful lives and the residual values of these assets. Therefore, future depreciation charges could be revised. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment and investment property and the depreciation charge for the year are disclosed in notes 9 and 10 to the financial statements respectively.

(A) Key Sources Of Estimation Uncertainty (continued)

(ii) Income Taxes

Significant judgment is involved in determining the provision for income taxes. There are certain transactions and computations for which the ultimate tax determination is uncertain during the ordinary course of business. The Group recognises liabilities for expected tax issues based on estimates of whether additional taxes will be due. Where the final tax outcome of these matters is different from the amounts that were initially recognised, such differences will impact the income tax provision in the period in which such determination is made. There were no significant deferred tax liabilities as at the balance sheet date. The carrying amount of the Group's current tax liabilities as at the balance sheet date is disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.

(iii) Expected Credit Losses On Receivables

Expected Credit Losses ("ECLs") are probability-weighted estimates of credit losses over the life of a financial instrument. In estimating ECLs to determine the probability of default of its debtors, the Group has used historical information, such as past credit loss experience. Where applicable, historical data are adjusted to reflect the effects of current conditions as well as management's assessment of future economic conditions based on observable market information, which involved significant estimates and judgement. Based on management's assessment, there are no ECLs on the Group's receivables at the balance sheet date.

(B) Critical Judgments Made In Applying Accounting Policies

In the process of applying the Group's accounting policies, the management has made certain of critical judgments apart from those involving estimates, which have significant effect on the amounts recognised in the financial statements.

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

The carrying amounts of the Group's non-financial assets subject to impairment are reviewed at each balance sheet date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated based on the higher of the value in use and the asset's fair value less cost of disposal. Estimating the value in use requires critical judgment on the part of the management to make an estimate of the expected future cash flows from the continuing use of the assets and also to choose a suitable discount rate in order to calculate the present value of those cash flows.

2.3 FRSs issued but not yet effective

The Group has not applied any new FRS that has been issued but is not yet effective. The management plans to adopt these FRSs in the first financial year commencing on or after their respective effective dates.

The management does not expect the adoption of the new FRSs to have material impact on the financial statements in the period of initial application.

2.4 Revenue Recognition

Revenue is measured based on the consideration to which the Group expects to be entitled in exchange for transferring promised goods or services to a customer, excluding amounts collected on behalf of third parties.

Revenue is recognised when the Group satisfies a performance obligation by transferring a promised good or service to the customer, to which is when the customer obtains control of the good or service. A performance obligation may be satisfied at a point in time or over time. The amount of revenue recognised is the amount allocated to the satisfied performance obligation.

(i) Course and seminar fees

Income from course and seminar fees (from continuing professional education and training) are recognised when the services are rendered.

(ii) Sponsorships

Income from sponsorships is recognised when received or when it becomes receivable and related performance obligations are fulfilled.

(iii) Subscriptions and entrance fees

Membership subscriptions are recognised as income over the membership term and entrance fees are recognised as income when they are due.

(iv) Advertising income

Advertising income is recognised when advertisements are placed and the related performance obligations are fulfilled.

(v) Rental income

Rental income from operating lease is recognised on a straight line basis over the lease period.

(vi) Interest income

Interest income is recognised in profit or loss on a time-proportion basis, using the effective interest method.

2.5 Government Grants

Government grants are recognised when there is reasonable assurance that the grant will be received and the conditions attached to the grant will be complied with. Grants related to income are recognised in profit or loss on a systematic basis over the periods in which the Group recognises as expenses the related costs for which the grants are intended to compensate.

2.6 Employee Benefits

(i) Defined Contribution Plans

The Group makes contributions to the state provident fund (Central Provident Fund). Such contributions are recognised as compensation expenses in the same period as the employment that gave rise to the contributions.

(ii) Short-term Compensated Absences

Employee entitlements to annual leave are recognised when they accrue to employees. A provision is made for the estimated liability for employee entitlements to annual leave as a result of services rendered by employees up to the balance sheet date.

2.7 Income Taxes

Income tax on the profit or loss for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Income tax is recognised in profit or loss except to the extent that it relates to items recognised outside profit or loss (either in other comprehensive income or directly to accumulated fund), in which case, it is recognised in other comprehensive income or directly to accumulated fund accordingly.

Current tax is the expected tax payable on the taxable income for the year, using tax rates enacted or substantially enacted at the balance sheet date, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

Deferred income tax is provided, using the balance sheet liability method, on all temporary differences at the balance sheet date arising between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts in the financial statements. Currently enacted tax rates are used in the determination of deferred income tax.

Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which the temporary differences can be utilised.

Deferred income tax is provided on all taxable temporary differences arising on investment in subsidiary company except where the timing of the reversal of the temporary difference can be controlled and it is probable that the temporary difference will not reverse in the foreseeable future.

Deferred tax is charged or credited to other comprehensive income or directly in accumulated fund if the tax relates to items that are credited or charged, in the same or a different period, to other comprehensive income or directly to accumulated fund.

2.8 Property, Plant and Equipment

All items of property, plant and equipment are initially recorded at cost. The cost of an item of property, plant and equipment is recognised as an asset when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Group and the cost of the item can be measured reliably.

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment loss, if any.

Any estimated costs of dismantling and removing the property, plant and equipment and reinstating the site to its original condition (reinstatement costs) are capitalised as part of the cost of the property, plant and equipment.

Depreciation is calculated on the straight line basis so as to write off the cost, less the residual value, of the assets over their estimated useful lives. The estimated useful lives are as follows:

Fully depreciated assets are retained in the financial statements until they are no longer in use.

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods of property, plant and equipment are reviewed and adjusted as appropriate, at each financial year end.

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. Any gain or loss arising on derecognition of the assets is recognised in profit or loss in the year the asset is derecognised.

2.9 Investment Property

Investment property, which is held on a long term basis for investment potential and for generating rental income is stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and any impairment loss. Depreciation is calculated on the straight line basis so as to write off the cost, less residual value, of the assets over their estimated useful lives. The estimated useful life of the investment property is as follows:

The residual value, useful life and depreciation method of investment property are reviewed and adjusted as appropriate, at each financial year end.

The cost of major renovations and improvements is capitalised as additions and the carrying amounts of replaced components are written off to profit or loss. The costs of maintenance, repairs and minor improvement are charged to profit or loss when incurred.

Upon the disposal of investment property, the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset is recognised in profit or loss.

2.10 Financial Assets

A. Classification

Financial assets are classified into the following measurement categories:

- Amortised cost;
- Fair value through other comprehensive income (FVOCI); and
- Fair value through profit or loss (FVPL).

The basis of classification depends on the Group's business model and the contractual cash flow characteristics of the financial assets.

B. At initial recognition

At initial recognition, the Group measures a financial asset at its fair value plus, in the case of a financial asset not at fair value through profit or loss, transaction costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition of the financial assets. Transaction costs of financial assets carried at fair value through profit or loss are expensed in profit or loss. Receivables that do not have a significant financing component are measured at their transaction price at initial recognition.

C. At subsequent measurement

There are three prescribed subsequent measurement categories - at amortised cost, FVOCI and FVPL, depending on the Group's business model in managing the financial assets and the cash flow characteristics of the assets.

The Group's financial assets, comprising mainly of receivables, and cash and cash equivalents, are measured at amortised cost subsequent to initial recognition, as these represent contractual cash flows which are solely payments of principal and interest. A gain or loss on a financial asset that is subsequently measured at amortised cost and is not part of a hedging relationship is recognised in profit or loss when the asset is derecognised or impaired. Interest income from these financial assets are recognised using the effective interest rate method.

D. Impairment of Financial Assets

The Group assesses on forward looking basis the expected credit losses associated with its debt instruments carried at amortised cost, and recognises a loss allowance accordingly.

At each reporting date, the debt instruments are assessed to determine whether there is significant increase in credit risk on the debt instruments since initial recognition. If there is a significant increase in credit risk since initial recognition, lifetime expected credit losses will be calculated and recognised in the loss allowance. If credit risk on the debt instrument has not increased significantly since initial recognition, the loss allowance is measured based on 12-month expected credit losses. Adjustments to the loss allowance are recognised in profit or loss as an impairment gain or loss

For receivables, the Group applies the simplified approach permitted by FRS 109, which requires expected lifetime losses to be recognised from initial recognition of the receivables.

2.11 Investment in Subsidiary Company

(i) Subsidiary and Basis of Consolidation

Investment in subsidiary company is held on a long term basis and stated in the Group's balance sheet at cost less impairment loss, if any.

Subsidiary is the entity over which the Group has control. The Group controls an entity when the Group is exposed to, or has rights to, variable returns from its involvement with the entity and has the ability to affect those returns through its power over the entity. Subsidiary is consolidated from the date on which control is transferred to the Group, and continues to be consolidated until the date that such control ceases.

The consolidated financial statements comprise the financial statements of the College and its subsidiary company made up to the balance sheet date. The financial statements of the subsidiary company is prepared for the same reporting date as the College. Consistent accounting policies are applied for like transactions and events in similar circumstances.

All intra-group balances, income and expenses and unrealised gains and losses resulting from intra-group transactions are eliminated in full.

(ii) Acquisitions

The acquisition method of accounting is used to account for business combinations by the Group. The consideration transferred for the acquisition of a subsidiary or business comprises the fair value of the assets transferred, the liabilities incurred and the equity interests issued by the Group. The consideration transferred also includes the fair value of any contingent consideration arrangement and the fair value of any pre-existing equity interest in the subsidiary.

Acquisition-related costs are expensed as incurred. Identifiable assets acquired and liabilities and contingent liabilities assumed in a business combination are, with limited exceptions, measured initially at their fair values at the acquisition date. On an acquisition-by-acquisition basis, the Group recognises any non-controlling interest in the acquiree at the date of acquisition either at fair value or at the non-controlling interest's proportionate share of the acquiree's net identifiable assets.

The excess of the consideration transferred, the amount of any non-controlling interest in the acquiree and the acquisition-date fair value of any previous equity interest in the acquiree over the fair value of the net identifiable assets acquired is recorded as goodwill.

Any excess of the Group's interests in the net fair value of the identifiable assets, liabilities and contingent liabilities over the cost of business combination is recognised in profit or loss on the date of acquisition.

(iii) Disposals

When a change in the Group ownership interest in a subsidiary results in a loss of control over the subsidiary, the assets and liabilities of the subsidiary including any goodwill are derecognised. Amounts previously recognised in other comprehensive income in respect of that entity are also reclassified to profit or loss or transferred directly to retained earnings if required by a specific Standard.

Any retained equity interest in the entity is remeasured at fair value. The difference between the carrying amount of the retained interest at the date when control is lost and its fair value is recognised in profit or loss.

2.12 Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables that do not have a significant financing component are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any allowance for expected credit losses, as explained in note 2.10 (D).

2.13 Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash in hand, cash at bank and fixed deposits which are subject to insignificant risks of changes in value. For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, fixed deposits with original maturities more than 3 months are excluded from cash and cash equivalents.

2.14 Funds

Accumulated fund is unrestricted fund available for use at the discretion of the Management Committee for the furtherance of the Group's objectives.

Miscellaneous funds are restricted funds which are designated for awards, fellowships, research support and projects of the Group. Currently, the Group has 6 miscellaneous funds, namely, Dr Koh Eng Kheng Award Fund, Primary Care Research Fund, Victor Louis Fernandez Fellowship Fund, Albert & Mary Lim Award Fund, Primary Care Conference Programme Fund and Primary Care Research Network Fund as disclosed in note 17 to the financial statements.

2.15 Financial liabilities

Financial liabilities include other payables and lease liabilities. Financial liabilities are recognised on the balance sheet when the Group becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument.

Financial liabilities are recognised initially at fair value, plus, in the case of financial liabilities not at fair value through profit and loss, directly attributable transaction costs.

Subsequent to initial recognition, all financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, except for financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss, including derivatives, which are measured at fair value. Financial liabilities with a short duration are not discounted.

2.16 Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

The carrying amounts of the Group's non-financial assets subject to impairment are reviewed at each balance sheet date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated. An impairment loss is recognised whenever the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the greater of the asset's fair value less cost of disposal and its value in use. The value in use is the present value of estimated future cash flows expected to arise from the continuing use of the asset and from its disposal at the end of its useful life.

An impairment loss on a non-revalued asset is recognised in profit or loss. An impairment loss on a revalued asset is recognised in other comprehensive income to the extent that the impairment loss does not exceed the amount in the revaluation surplus for that same asset. An impairment loss (except for impairment loss on goodwill) is reversed if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount or when there is an indication that the impairment loss recognised for the asset no longer exists or decreases. An impairment loss is reversed only to the extent that the asset's carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined if no impairment loss had been recognised.

2.17 Leases

The Group assesses at contract inception whether a contract is, or contains, a lease. That is, if the contract conveys the right to control the use of an identified asset for a period of time in exchange for consideration.

2.17.1 As lessee

The Group applies a single recognition and measurement approach for all leases, except for short-term leases and leases of low-value assets. The Group recognises lease liabilities representing the obligations to make lease payments and right-of-use assets representing the right to use the underlying leased assets.

(a) *Right-of-use assets*

The Group recognises right-of-use assets at the commencement date of the lease (i.e. the date the underlying asset is available for use). Right-of-use assets are measured at cost, less any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, and adjusted for any remeasurement of lease liabilities. The cost of right-of-use assets includes the amount of lease liabilities recognised, initial direct costs incurred, and lease payments made at or before the commencement date less any lease incentives received. Right-of-use assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of the lease term and the estimated useful lives of the assets.

If ownership of the leased asset transfers to the Group at the end of the lease term or the cost reflects the exercise of a purchase option, depreciation is calculated using the estimated useful life of the asset. The right-of-use assets are also subject to impairment. The accounting policy for impairment is disclosed in note 2.16.

(b) *Lease liabilities*

At the commencement date of the lease, the Group recognises lease liabilities measured at the present value of lease payments to be made over the lease term. The lease payments include fixed payments (including in-substance fixed payments) less any lease incentives receivable, variable lease payments that depend on an index or a rate, and amounts expected to be paid under residual value guarantees. The lease payments also include the exercise price of a purchase option reasonably certain to be exercised by the Group and payments of penalties for terminating the lease, if the lease term reflects the Group exercising the option to terminate. Variable lease payments that do not depend on an index or a rate are recognised as expenses (unless they are incurred to produce inventories) in the period in which the event or condition that triggers the payment occurs.

In calculating the present value of lease payments, the Group uses its incremental borrowing rate at the lease commencement date because the interest rate implicit in the lease is not readily determinable. After the commencement date, the amount of lease liabilities is increased to reflect the accretion of interest and reduced for the lease payments made. In addition, the carrying amount of lease liabilities is remeasured if there is a modification, a change in the lease term, a change in the lease payments (e.g. changes to future payments resulting from a change in an index or rate used to determine such lease payments) or a change in the assessment of an option to purchase the underlying asset.

The Group's lease liabilities are presented in note 19.

(c) *Short-term leases and leases of low-value assets*

The Group applies the short-term lease recognition exemption to its short-term leases (i.e. those leases that have a lease term of 12 months or less from the commencement date and do not contain a purchase option). It also applies the lease of low-value assets recognition exemption to leases that are considered to be low value. Lease payments on short-term leases and leases of low value assets are recognised as expense on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

2.17.2 As lessor

Leases in which the Group does not transfer substantially all the risks and rewards incidental to ownership of an asset are classified as operating leases. Rental income arising from operating leases on the Group's investment property is accounted for on a straight-line basis over the lease terms. Initial direct costs incurred in negotiating and arranging an operating lease are added to the carrying amount of the leased asset and recognised over the lease term on the same basis as rental income. Contingent rents are recognised as revenue in the period in which they are earned.

2.18 Foreign Currency Transactions and Translation

Foreign currency transactions are recorded, on initial recognition, in the functional currency (Singapore dollars) by applying to the foreign currency amounts the rates of exchange prevailing on the transaction dates. Recorded monetary items that are denominated in foreign currencies as at balance sheet date are translated at the rates ruling on that date. Gain or losses on foreign currency translation are included in profit or loss. Non-monetary assets and liabilities that are measured in historical cost in a foreign currency are translated using the exchange rates as at the dates of the initial transactions. Non-monetary assets and liabilities measured at fair value in a foreign currency are translated using the exchange rates at the date when the fair value was determined.

2.19 Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Group has a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events, it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, and a reliable estimate of the amount can be made.

2.20 Related Parties

A related party is defined as follows:

- (A) A person or a close member of that person's family is related to the reporting entity if that person:
- (i) Has control or joint control over the reporting entity;
 - (ii) Has significant influence over the reporting entity; or
 - (iii) Is a member of the key management personnel of the reporting entity or of a parent of the reporting entity.

(B) An entity is related to the reporting entity if any of the following conditions applies:

- (ii) One entity is an associate or joint venture of the other entity (or an associate or joint venture of a member of a group of which the other entity is a member).
- (iii) Both entities are joint ventures of the same third party;
- (iv) One entity is a joint venture of a third entity and the other entity is an associate of the third entity.
- (v) The entity is a post-employment benefit plan for the benefit of employees of either the College or an entity related to the reporting entity. If the reporting entity is itself such a plan, the sponsoring employers are also related to the reporting entity.
- (vi) The entity is controlled or jointly controlled by a person identified in (A).
- (vii) A person identified in (A)(i) has significant influence over the entity or is a member of the key management personnel of the entity (or of a parent of the entity).
- (viii) The entity, or any member of a group of which it is a part, provides key management personnel services to the reporting entity or to the parent of the reporting entity.

24. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

The Group and the College are exposed to financial risks arising from its operations and the use of financial instruments. The key financial risks are credit risk, liquidity risk and interest rate risk. The management reviews and agrees on policies for managing each of these risks and they are summarised below:

24.1 Credit risk

Credit risk is the potential risk of financial loss resulting from the failure of customers or other counterparties to settle their financial and contractual obligations to the Group as and when they fall due.

(i) *Risk Management*

The Group's exposure to credit risk arises primarily from trade and other receivables. For other financial assets, including cash and cash equivalents, the Company mitigates credit risks by transacting with high credit rating counter parties and financial institutions which are regulated.

Management regularly monitors credit risk exposure to customers. Cash and cash equivalents are placed with financial institutions which are regulated.

At the balance sheet date, there is no significant concentration of credit risk. The maximum exposure to credit risk is represented by the carrying amount of each financial asset in the balance sheet.

(ii) *Recognition of Expected Credit Losses (ECL)*

The Group's financial assets that are subject to credit losses where the expected credit loss model has been applied are trade receivables. The Group assesses on forward looking basis the expected credit losses on its trade receivables, and recognises a loss allowance in accordance with FRS 109.

Based on the Group's historical collection trend, most receivables are settled within the credit term. Any receivables that are settled after their due dates are not significant, and there is a low risk of default. Receivables are assessed on a collective basis to determine whether there are changes in credit risk. Lifetime expected credit losses are recognised for specific receivables for which credit risk is deemed to have increased significantly.

24.2 Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Group will encounter difficulty in meeting financial obligations due to shortage of funds.

The Group monitors its liquidity risk and maintains a level of cash and cash equivalents deemed adequate to finance the Group's operations and to mitigate the effects of fluctuations in cash flows.

All financial liabilities of the Group and the College are repayable on demand or will mature within one year except lease liabilities.

24.3 Interest rate risk

Interest rate risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of the Group's financial instruments will fluctuate because of changes in market interest rates.

The Group does not have any interest-bearing financial liabilities. Its only exposure to changes in interest rates relates to interest-earning fixed deposits. The Group monitors the movements in interest rates to ensure deposits are placed with financial institutions offering optimal rates of return.

25. FUND MANAGEMENT

The primary objective of the Group's fund management policy is to ensure that it maintains strong and healthy capital ratios in order to support its operations and future growth.

The Group targets to maintain an optimum level of accumulated fund. The Group regularly reviews and manages its reserves to ensure optimal capital structure, taking into consideration the future capital requirements of the Group and capital efficiency, prevailing and projected income, projected operating cash flows and projected capital expenditures.

The Group is not subject to externally imposed capital requirements.

There were no changes to the Group's approach to fund management since the previous financial year.

26. FAIR VALUE OF FINANCIAL ASSETS AND LIABILITIES

(a) Fair Value Hierarchy

The Group categorises fair value measurements using a fair value hierarchy that is dependent on the valuation inputs used, as follows:

- Level 1 - quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities
- Level 2 - valuation techniques using inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly (i.e. as prices) or indirectly (i.e. derived from prices)
- Level 3 - valuation techniques using inputs for the asset or liability that are not based on observable market data (unobservable inputs)

(b) Fair Value of Non-Financial Assets

The Group does not apply fair value accounting in the measurement of its non-financial assets. However, the fair value of investment property is disclosed in note 10 for compliance with FRS 40 Investment Property.

(c) Fair Value of Financial Instruments

Financial Instruments Not Carried at Fair Value

Cash and cash equivalents, receivables and payables are measured at amortised cost. Financial instruments with a short duration are not discounted.

It is not practicable to determine with sufficient reliability the fair value of the interest-free amount owing by the subsidiary company to the College which is classified as non-current receivable. This amount is not expected to be received within the short term but does not have an agreed specified period of repayment. Accordingly, this amount is carried at original cost.

(d) Transfer between Levels of Fair Value Hierarchy

There were no assets or liabilities transferred between Level 1 and Level 2 or transfers into or out of Level 3. The College's policy is to recognise transfer (if any) between levels of fair value hierarchy at the end of the reporting period during which they occur.

HERALDRY OF THE COLLEGE

The upper portion of the badge of the College consists of a golden lion in a passant stance superimposed on the chief, which is red in colour.

The lion represents our nation of Singapore. Red is the colour of blood, which is the precious liquid on which life depends and which is our mission to save.

The lower portion of the badge consists of a green cross superimposed on a white shield. The green cross symbolises the humanitarian mission of our College. White is the colour of purity, which is our aim.

On the green cross is superimposed an open book and a caduceus. The open book represents knowledge and continued learning and the caduceus is the recognised symbol for the art of healing.
